DISASTER RECOVERY CENTER TO OPEN IN CAMDEN COUNTY TO ASSIST HURRICANE SURVIVORS

NEPTUNE, N.J. – A FEMA/State Disaster Recovery Center (DRC) will open Saturday, Sept. 17, in Camden County to provide face-to-face assistance to those who suffered damage and losses from Hurricane Irene.

The center will be open from **8 a.m. to 6 p.m**., seven days a week, until further notice. Residents are urged to register before visiting a DRC.

Those with access or functional needs and who use a TTY, call 800-462-7585; or, use 711 or Video Relay Service to call 800-621-3362. Both numbers are available from 7 a.m. – 10 p.m.

At the center, visitors can:

- Receive information about different types of state and federal disaster assistance.
- Get help completing applications for U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) low-interest disaster loans for homeowners, renters, businesses of all sizes and private nonprofit organizations.
- Inquire about the status of applications for federal assistance.
- Receive referrals to voluntary organizations to help with immediate unmet needs.
- Learn cost-effective measures to reduce the impact of future disaster losses.
