Seeking approval to delegate DPW to begin "Clean-up" of this site.

DPW Work Trailer rental for the month of March - \$435.00 (Monthly Rate).

CFO advised "Current Plan" could be as much as 0.04 cent tax increase. The CFO will investigate running a proposed pay-out schedule from Phoenix. The CFO will also investigate implementation through stages.

The current decision to borrow is in a hold pattern to analyze the cost of material & interest on loans.
